On February 11, 2012 our speaker James Nachtwey '70 became the third recipient (along with Mikhail Gorbachev and Daniel Barenboim) of the Dresden International Peace Prize which "recognizes extraordinary services by outstanding people who above all act to help prevent escalations of violence." Jim is also a winner of a TED Prize, a Heinz Foundation Award, a five-time recipient of the Robert Capa Gold Medal, and is the subject of the Academy-Award nominated documentary War Photographer.

Jim will speak briefly about his career and how he approaches his art, and then give us a visual tour of world history since 1981, as seen through his eyes. Jim's presentation includes both beautiful and graphic images depicting the realities of war, famine, and poverty. Q&A will follow his 45 minute presentation.

This year's seminar will be in 2 parts.

Part 1: Behind the Curtain: Dartmouth's Year of the Arts

The program focus for this year's seminar will be Dartmouth's Year of the Arts and specifically on the interdisciplinary and cross-campus scholarly components of the Year of the Arts, rather than the highly visible and better-known performance and exhibition aspects. The participants will also offer insights into the early visioning for the Year of the Arts and the aspirations that our Dartmouth Leadership has for this celebration's outcomes for faculty, students, the College, and the Upper Valley community.

Part 2: Learning to Look

Conducted by Hood Museum staff and docents Our society has developed an educational model that serves our citizen's needs to read, write, count and compute, but which is not effective in developing the skills of looking at, seeing, describing, and interpreting visual images. "Learning to Look" created by the Hood Museum of Art is a five step approach designed to help viewers look carefully at and think critically about any work of art they encounter. Developed originally to equip regional teachers of all grade levels and subjects to integrate art into the curriculum, it is a technique that has proven to be empowering for a much broader audience, e.g. all Geisel School of Medicine students participate in this exercise because of its effectiveness in improving accuracy in "reading" visual images of the human body.
