Speaker: Ambassador James C. Cason '66, formerly "Principal Officer of the U.S. Interests Section in Havana". This will be most timely and fascinating to hear what he has to say about relations between the U.S. and Cuba. He was also U.S. Ambassador to Paraguay, and also served as Deputy Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in Tegucigalpa, Honduras, and Kingston, Jamaica. Previously he served as Political Advisor to the Commander of the U.S. Atlantic Command (USACOM) and to NATO's Supreme Allied Commander Atlantic (SACLANT). Ambassador Cason also served at U.S. missions in Milan, Italy; Lisbon, Portugal; San Salvador, El Salvador; Panama City, Panama; Maracaibo, Venezuela; Montevideo, Uruguay; and La Paz, Bolivia. He is currently Mayor of Coral Gables, Florida.

Recent Event: Pungent Prints and Piquant Paintings

On March 25, DCUV members were treated to a fun, educational evening at the **Long River Studios and Gallery** in Lyme NH. Included was a tour of the studios hosted by manager Dave Celone to view some of their very unique offerings along with free wine tasting provided by Peter Rutledge owner of **Norwich Wines**.

We then had a very interesting talk and demonstration by Louise Hamlin,, George Frederick Jewett Professor of Studio Art" at Dartmouth College. This was an opening presentation of her special custom fabricated prints along with a full explanation of the complex process that is used to make them. Her original artwork is digitally scanned at Thayer School of Engineering followed by 3D engraving to make master printing plates. She then uses these plates with different inks to custom print the final images that were on display and for sale.

Phil will lead a panel of 6 Veterans ranging from Viet Nam to Iraq to discuss: "Dartmouth Veterans - Vietnam Perspectives" and the eponymous book of which Morton Kondracke writes:

"These essays offer a remarkable look into almost the full range of Vietnam-era military experience—from harrowing danger and selfless heroism to desk-bound tedium, from pride in serving to disillusionment with the mission and the way it was conducted. It enriches the entire Dartmouth community to have these stories told."

These are tales of what it was like for young men to go from the bucolic hills of New Hampshire to a land wracked by war and violence. The result is a collection of more than fifty accounts, showing the variety of experiences and reactions to this dramatic period in American history. Some soldiers were drafted, some volunteered; some supported the war, but many turned against it. Common to all the stories is the way in which war changes men, for good and ill, and the way in which the Vietnam experience colored so much of the rest of these writers' lives."
