Two Great Events Dealing The Town of Hanover , Dartmouth and Possibly The World's Needed Efforts to Clean Up Our Energy Efficiency - also reduce global warming.



Long time Hanover Town Manager, Julia Griffin gave a very meaningful talk at our DCUV Tuesday Night reception , January 19th.

Her talk dealt with what the town is doing to improve energy efficiency and help reduce the use of dirty #6 fuel oil in many of the Hanover plants such as putting wood pellet boilers in the Fire and Police Dept. buildings.

She is also working with Dartmouth on many mutual projects and particularly Lisa Hogarty, Vice

President responsible for all facilities and is working on a number of energy projects including a plan to replace the oil fired boilers that Dartmouth uses to generate steam and electricity.

At a DCUV Board Meeting, member Stan Colla convinced the Board to help sponsor a Sierra Club managed **Renewable Energy Forum** that took place the next night, Jan. 20 in Moore Hall. Stan and I both attended and to be honest were amazed at the ideas that were presented by a panel which included Lisa Hogarty and a Thayer Engineer, Sol Diamond and Mark Jacobson who communicated by Skype from Stanford U. His World Wide plan is

to eliminate all uses of oil, gas and coal use by 2050 and replace all energy usage with electricity that is generated by wind, water, and solar per the charts below. There is no universal agreement but it sure makes you think twice! With Adobe Reader - blow up this page to see the charts.
