Recent events at DCUV

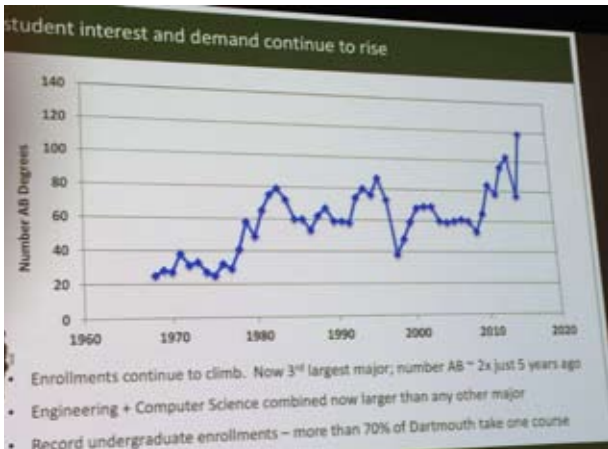
Our January 17 meeting was a very interesting talk from Dean of Thayer Engineering School Joe Helble entitled:

halftime in most games and makes practice much safer since it can be tackled with less chance of injury or concussion for either

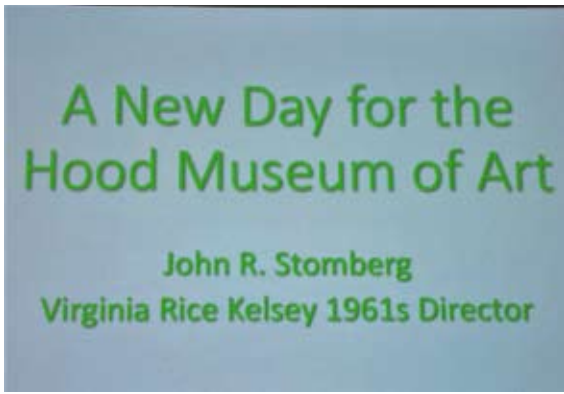


- Accommodate demand for engineering embedded w/in liberal arts – “liberal engineering”
